CALENDER AND MCGEE GRADUATE FROM COLLEGE OF DIRECT SUPPORT

The curriculum is also updated constantly so that participants have access to the most up-do-date information. Some of the courses offered include Direct Support Professionalism, Documentation, Introduction to Medication Support and Working with Families and Support Networks.
