Volunteers and employees will be spending the coming weeks preparing for Santa Day, and there will be plenty of opportunities for anyone who would like to volunteer their time, energy or talents to other people during this time of year. During this time, the Building 71 Public Relations Conference Center becomes known as "The Christmas House" as gifts are prepared and sorted into the individualized gift bags that will be delivered on Santa Day.

Many volunteer groups come year after year and have become fixtures around the campus during the season. Groups from all over the state travel to the hospital, coming as families, service clubs and church groups to not only host parties and dinners, but bring gifts and donations.
